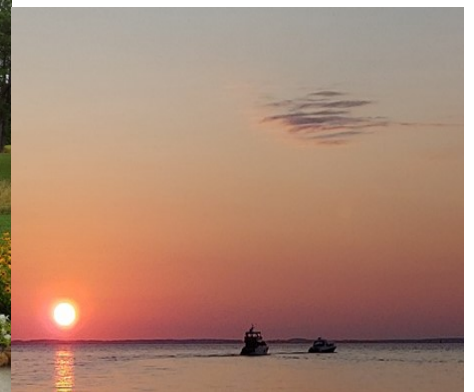

AUG 9-12: TIDES INN CRUISE (Commodore’s Cruise): Our Commodore, Captain Dennis Gatens, and First Lady Robyn, are leading the cruise to Tides Inn, a beautiful resort with Inn and Marina on Carter’s Creek off the Rappahannock River. Dropping The Hook With Consideration For Others

There is a lot of anchoring going on: Sea Ray Bay, Both Tim's, Mattawoman Creek, Wade's Bay, and the Three Sisters are but some of the places that get crowded on a nice day.

Whether you have a "big" vessel or a "small" vessel, these are the top 10 rude behaviors that the Blackwell's believe show disrespect in an anchorage. Some additional ones are added after the top 10.

All of us probably have been guilty of one (or more) of these behaviors over the years and at one time or another. Check the ones that are appropriate for you.

- ◇ Anchoring too close to another vessel that got there first.
- ◇ Shouting above engine noise.
- ◇ Anchoring with different configuration than other vessels in the anchorage.
- ◇ Shining a spotlight directly at anchored vessels.
- ◇ Anchoring upwind of vessels and barbecuing odiferous meals on deck.
- ◇ Running a generator very early in the morning or late into the night.
- ◇ Allowing a dog to continue barking for prolonged periods.
- ◇ Creating a wake in an anchorage.
- ◇ Incessant cell phone ringing.
- ◇ Playing loud music in proximity to others

Some other anchorage behaviors that also might be considered rude:

- ◇ Emptying a holding tank in an anchorage where people are swimming.
- ◇ Throwing waste overboard.
- ◇ Allowing halyards to slap against a spar all night.
- ◇ Keeping navigation lights burning all night.
- ◇ Not turning on anchor light(s).
- ◇ Conducting "party" boat activities into the early morning hours.
- ◇ Running the vessel into shallow water where people are swimming and scrubbing the exterior fiberglass.

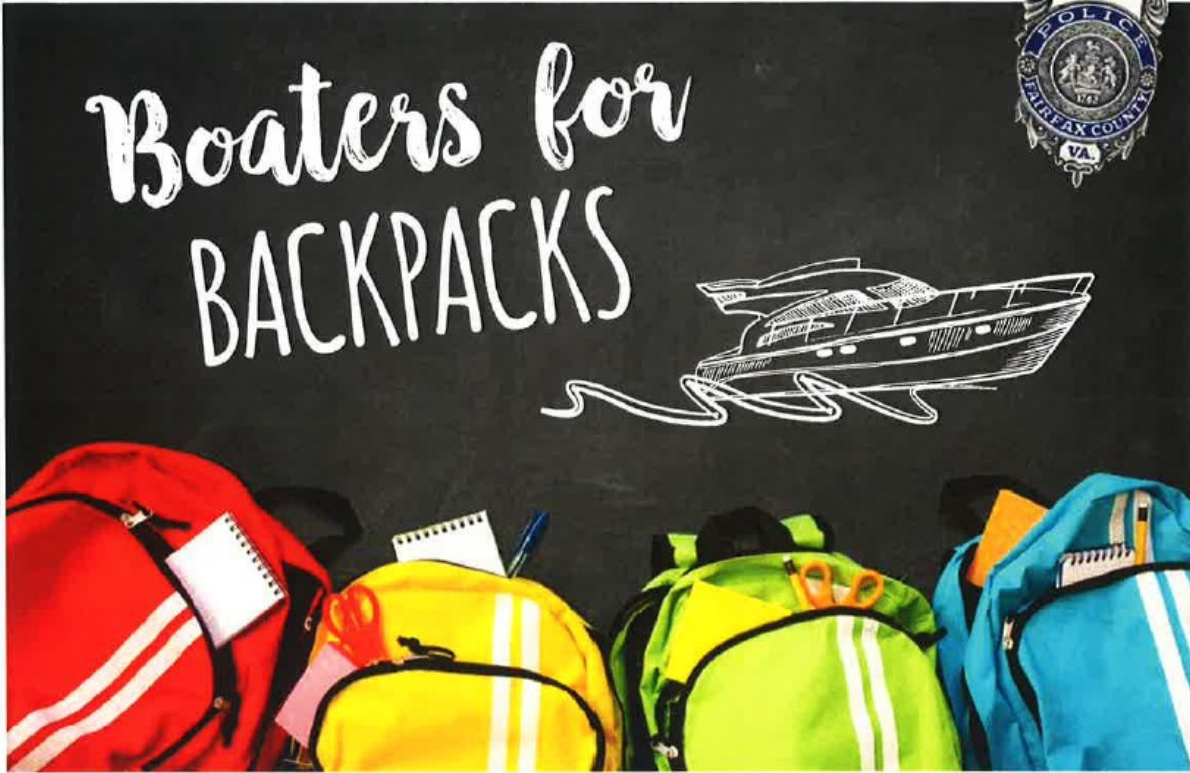

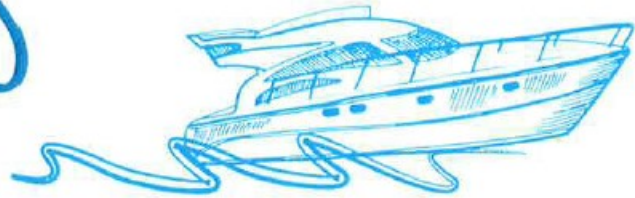

Freeze Bullying for Payton (Payton's Project):

Bullying/Cyberbullying affects 1 out of every 4 students. Payton's Project is a 501c3 non-profit, 100% volunteer organization. It was formed in February of 2016 after Payton Rose Freeze took her own life due to being bullied at school, exacerbated by traumatic brain injury caused by a concussion.

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, Payton's Project is able to educate our community on the devastating effects of bullying/cyberbullying, offer scholarships to students who have either demonstrated efforts to combat bullying/cyberbullying in their community, or have been a victim of bullying and persevered, and offer hope and support to students who are being bullied through our Payton's Peers Program. In Payton's Peers, aged defined groups from elementary school through college, are able to share thoughts and emotions in a small group forum that focuses on student-led strength and sustenance on a weekly basis. Each session is led by a trained mentor, and encourages an opportunity for members to share past or current experiences with bullying behavior in a supportive, non-judgmental environment, while building resiliency and learning coping mechanisms. Payton's Peers is a FREE program. It has been said that it takes a village to raise a child. Payton's Project also believes it takes a village to save one.

Patriot Cruise and Salute:

Patriot Cruise and Salute is a non-profit charitable organization formed to organize free recreational boating events to benefit wounded, injured, and ill veterans of the United States Armed Forces.

The vision of Patriot Cruise and Salute is anywhere there are boaters and wounded warriors a Patriot Cruise event can be hosted. We hope to expand to other locations across the country to support more veterans and wounded warriors.

Founded by two retired military officers, Patriot Cruise and Salute provides recuperating veterans and their families a day of boating and camaraderie on the Potomac River, recognizing that healing veterans and their families at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center and Fort Belvoir Community Hospital are often separated from their homes, extended families and their friends. Each year the community comes together to say "Thank You" to these wounded veterans and their families, by providing a much-needed mental respite from their medical concerns.

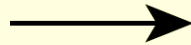
