

OFF THE BEATEN PATH AND DEEP DIVE: FIREWORKS

Need some ideas for where to go on a free weekend? Here are a few. Please confirm dates/times before setting out as may have changed. Times listed are one-way cruise times at 25-28mph.

DEEP DIVE: FIREWORKS

Since Fourth of July is just around the corner, here are also some on-the-water fireworks.

Sat June 29 "Not on the 4th Fireworks" at Tim's Rivershore (Dumfries). Anchor out. Recommend view from Mattawoman Creek (and anchor overnight) as area by Tim's may be packed with boaters.

Sat June 29 Mt Vernon Fireworks 6-9:45pm, anchor out.

Wed 3 July Nats Stadium, Post game fireworks. Yards Marina.

Thu 4 July DAYTIME Mt Vernon Fireworks over Potomac 9am-5pm, anchor out.

Thu 4 July DC Fireworks 9pm. Many options to view. Many people say the safest is to watch from a marina or from an overnight anchoring at 3 Sisters, as water traffic can be extra crowded and other boaters may have been drinking all day then driving home at night. Anchor at 3 Sisters, or closest marina to view used to be (not sure with this year's changes) was Washington Marina, and could also be seen from slip at Capital Yacht Club or Wharf marinas. Others stay at Yards marina (or Alexandria or National Harbor) and take their boat out to view the fireworks. Slip reservations tend to fill early each year (by January for Washington Marina).

[2019 changes: DC Fireworks moving from Washington Monument to West end of the Mall (West Potomac Park). Metros not running South of Reagan airport all summer.]

Sat 6 July Reedville Old-Fashioned 4th. Fireworks over Cockrell Creek, around corner at end of Potomac.

Sat 13 July Alexandria Birthday Fireworks, Oronoco Bay Park 9pm. Alexandria Marina.




