

However, the weather gods were not smiling upon us and we cancelled the event in August. However, 3 Sisters Raftup lives again over Labor Day Weekend 3-6 Sept, in place of the Kent Island or Chesapeake Bay cruise. I am the Cruise Raft Captain, so I hope we can make it a joyous weekend on Labor Day Weekend (and not have a washout like the last 2 times for weather).

It will make all the functions of running a non-profit social club easier and coordinated. September means Labor Day, Back to School, the Fabulous PWYC Seafood Boil, an outdoor movie to kickoff Pirates Week, then Pirates Night on the Hook (PNOH) and a CAPT's hour with a Tropical theme sponsored by E/F/& G Docks. The Commodore forwarded this to Safety on or about July 13, 2021. It came from Skyler and Becky, Anger Management docked at G-23.

"On July 4th, while heading up to DC to raft up for the DC fireworks, there were 4 people in the water around the Wilson bridge. 2 were floating through the main boating corridor while 2 others were floating through the far left throughway of the bridge.

Becky called out to the 2 to the far left to make sure they were ok. They responded they needed immediate help as one said they couldn't swim. I immediately went over channel 16 that there were people in the water in need of assistance and diverted to assist. Luckily, they were wearing life jackets. Nick "Off Ice" was following and blocked area with his boat as to not allow other boats to come through. Deployed the life ring and pulled the two back to our boat and up onto the swim platform. MPD Harbor patrol arrived and we transferred the two to the MPD boat."

1. Kudos to the people in the water who were wearing life jackets. This might have saved at least one life.

2. Kudos to Anger Management, Off Ice and anyone else who helped during this event.

3. Kudos to Anger Management, Off Ice, and anyone else who realized that something was amiss.

4. Kudos to Anger Management and Off Ice because they were not so excited about their trip to see the fireworks that they forgot about being situationally aware. The waterways approaching the Wilson Bridge are particularly busy the days around July 4, especially if the weather is nice. It might be interesting to calculate how many vessels passed by the individuals in distress and did not realize that help was needed. The people needing help were lucky that those aboard Anger Management and Off Ice had the situational awareness and skill to act quickly and effectively. Situational Awareness (SA). What happened on the 4th is as probably a good example of SA as one can find. SA is a way to describe how we pay attention to our surroundings. It also involves the way we process elements in a situation to make informed decisions.

SA can be divided into three levels. These are:

1. An awareness of information (or perception). This is the ability to gather information from everything around us.

2. Comprehension. This involves the way we understand and analyze information.

3. Projection. This is the ability to use information from our surroundings to predict potential outcomes.

People with high SA are always aware of their surroundings. They pay close attention to the details sur-rounding them and use that information to predict future emergencies.

SA provides to us the tools to avoid accidents and disasters to ourselves. It also prepares us to act in the event anyone around us gets themselves into a pickle. Because this skill involves the ability to project fu-ture events based on our surroundings, many accidents and mishaps can be avoided.Factors Affecting SA. SA is not a permanent, fail-proof skill. There are factors that can decrease our situational awareness. Some of them we can control. Others we may not be able to control.

Stress and large workloads can limit SA because they leave less brain processing space to sort out current events. Likewise, illnesses and medications can affect the speed at which the brain processes information. This also affects SA.

While projection is important, holding strong preconceptions about a situation could limit our ability to re-act. Instead of focusing on one or two preconceptions, it's important to focus on your current surround-ings continuously, drawing new preconceptions of events as they continue to change.

How To Improve SA. Here are a few tips to help refine our SA skills:

1. It is helpful to begin by first practicing perception then proceeding to comprehension and projection. This means paying attention to our surroundings and asking ourselves if there's anything we might be missing. We should be using all of our senses, not just our eyes. The more we practice awareness of our surroundings, the more it will become a habit.

2. We should limit any overload situations as much as possible. Whoever is driving the boat should pay attention to driving the boat. For example, party time, socializing, focusing too much on the electron-ics, and thinking deep thoughts don't always go with good SA. These things limit the ability to process information, and be proactive (comprehension).

3. Anyone who has played baseball or softball probably has been asked by their coach, "What are you go-ing to do if the ball is hit to you?" The same goes for good SA. Following a plan(s) of action can proceed quickly if we imagine multiple potential situations and how we should react to each instead of just one.




Our club has also paid dues to PRYCA, CBYCA, and ORMA for 2021.

Through their resilience and commitment, our members have been able to safely enjoy our Father's Day Cruise, Captains' Hours, and look forward to Founder's Day and our annual Seafood Boil. The thread that ties all these spectacular activities together? – the volunteers who make 'em happen.

Our club is run by our Board of Directors. This consists of the five elected Flag Officers and the appointed Fleet Captains. Past Commodores are non-voting members of the Board. The Bridge is made up of the Board plus our Dock Reps and Club Delegates.

Each year, it's important to bring some fresh ideas and new energy to the PWYC Bridge, and that comes from our members. Being part of the Bridge is one of the most exciting and satisfying parts of boating with PWYC. You get to meet new people, learn how our club operates, and share the fun involved in running the best yacht



club on the Potomac. Hey, I know of what I speak...Ginger and I have been involved in some capacity now for over 17 years (nod to Tim and Barb Abel who were here at our founding)!

So, it's time to begin planning next year's Bridge as 2021 heads for the home stretch. Members currently serving in these positions may volunteer to run for office again. 
