Keep in mind that neither you nor the winner need be present at the CoW.

Too Ambitious?

Here is a list of the things that Safety would like to get done either before the 2020 boating season starts, early in the 2020 boating season, or during the 2020 boating season. Perhaps Safety is being too ambitions. Time will tell.

Some have already been placed on the calendar because there are more moving parts to consider, specifically scheduling instructors from the Coast Guard Auxiliary. We are trying to piggy back others with something already going on at the marina such as a Captains' Hour.

Already On The Calendar

Two Vessel Safety Check dates, April 25 and May 9. These have already been put on the calendar. There will be a sign-up list a couple of weeks or so beforehand.

Two Boating Safety Courses March 28 and May 9. Many thanks to the Coast Guard Auxiliary. These have already put on the calendar. One Safety Course has already been conducted.

Another stakeholder meeting regarding safety on the Occoquan. Hopefully, we can get this done before the season starts. There should be no problem with the PWYC calendar. The meeting will probably be held during the week, not on a Saturday or Sunday.

Trying To Piggy-Back

Fire extinguisher/flare demonstration/hands-on practice. The OWL Volunteer Fire Department has agreed to come to the marina on a mutually agreeable date and demonstrate how to use our fire extinguishers and flares. Each of us will have a hands-on opportunity to use both.

A Rules of The Road question and answer session. https://www.uscgq.com/ has hundreds of questions and answers regarding the rules of the road. All of the questions were used on various Master-Tonnage/OUPV-Six Pack licensing exams given by the Coast Guard.

On The Safety Wish List

Safety tried to get an AED/CPR/First Aid Course scheduled last year. There wasn't enough interest expressed by the PWYC members. The instructor Safety had scheduled required a minimum of ten people. Once there is an instructor scheduled, we will open it up to first PWYC members, then to the marina as a whole, then to whomever wants to commit. There will be a charge. The course, as of now, would combine an on-line portion that would be done at home and a hands-on portion that would be done at the marina. A certificate would be provided upon completion.

Navigation - The U.S. Aids to Navigation system; types of buoys and beacons; navigation rules (sometimes referred to as right-of-way rules); avoiding collisions; sound signals; PWC "tunnel vision."

Boating Problems - Hypothermia; boating accidents and rescues; man overboard recovery; capsizing; running aground; river hazards; strainers: emergency radio calls; engine problems; equipment failures; carbon monoxide (CO); other boating and PWC problems.


