

The Season Is A-Coming

The results are in of the investigation into the helicopter crash that took the life of Kobi Bryant and several others. The main finding was that "...was a well-regarded and experienced pilot [but] seemed to have suffered from what [can be] called 'sudden loss of judgment.' And that "Even good pilots can end up in bad situations..."

The marina will awaken in the next month or so. When things start hopping in the Boatel or around the docks usually depends on the service department. The sign that it is safe to consider de-winterizing, for example, is when service turns on the water to the docks.

What follows are one person's thoughts about not suffering from a sudden loss of judgment even by experienced boaters and about keeping ourselves out of bad situations. Some sources are included at the end.

Disclaimer, disclaimer: As always, everyone is on their own out there. Everyone is responsible for their own actions.

<u>Safety Is Always Job One</u>. We all must learn what we have to do to: meet any criteria we have to meet; pass any test(s) we have to pass; fix anything on our vessel that we have to fix; and install on our vessels whatever we need to install to keep ourselves and whomever we boat with or around safe. There is plenty of information on the Internet. Review the Coast Guard (CG) Recreational Accident reports to relate the most recent CG boating safety stats to the type of boat we have and the type of boating we do,

Should A Captain Be Hired? Most of us at Prince William Marina are able to provide ourselves with a realistic evaluation of our boating abilities. Perhaps lessons from a Captain are what we must do to shore up our weaknesses? For example, are we really ready to take guests out on our boat if we cannot return our boat to our slip within a reasonable number of tries? What about boating in the dark?

<u>Practice</u>, <u>Practice</u>. No one needs to be embarrassed practicing around the marina how to use their boats. Coming into and leaving the gas dock, for example, can be a challenge depending on wind, current, and/or traffic. The same goes for entering and leaving a slip or the fairway. Successful practice sessions may give us the confidence to stretch our boating envelope and do a little more the next time we go out. Or, to go a little further down river. Or, to take advantage of one or two of the trips planned by the Prince William Yacht Club.

- **Force Majeure.** "Force majeure" is a French term that relates to the concept of an act of God. For our purpose, it is a breakdown event for which a boat owner cannot be held accountable. Think a hidden wire getting rubbed raw and grounding. This is different from a lack of attention to taking care of a vessel. It is looking for trouble to go on the water on a boat that has not been properly maintained. Routine maintenance requires that things get repaired, replaced, or adjusted.
- Expect Things To Be Different. We should understand that the entire day or at least part of any day on the water is probably going to be different from any other day. Either we are going to do something we have never done before, or a different weather pattern sets in, or there is more traffic on the water than usual, etc. Our vessels should always be ready for a sudden change in conditions, as should we.
- Which Brings Us To Situational Awareness. Vibration and boredom can become problems as can focusing excessively on our cell phones, guests, electronics, etc. We must keep alert as to what is going on around us as well as any potential danger(s) that may come up. Go-fast-boats and fishing boats, for example, can pop up at any time. That where-did-he-come-from feeling can get scary.
- Proper Planning And Preparation Before Leaving The Marina. One thought is to think things backward.

 For example, if we know that we are going to head to The Yards for lunch, should we have our fenders and lines prepared ahead of time for use before leaving our slip or should someone be walking hurriedly around on the swim platform getting things out of the transom at the last minute?
- **Boating Means Different Things To Different People.** To some, boating is taking days-long trips. To others, it is taking day trips on the Potomac and perhaps dropping the hook at places like Mattawoman Creek for a leisurely afternoon. To a third group, boating is mostly hanging around the marina and enjoying the Prince William Yacht Club-sponsored social activities. Each group is correct.
- <u>Making Assumptions</u>. Let's be careful of assuming that the person operating the other vessel will follow the rules of the road. Just because we spend the time learning and applying the rules of the road does not mean that everyone else on the water will also. Let's be careful about assuming small craft advisories are for somebody else to worry about. Think hoping for the best but preparing for the worst.
- **Using Checklists.** Airplane pilots and doctors working in operating rooms use them. Checklists organize us without trusting our memories. One sure sign of someone not following a checklist is a vessel on the river with a fender flapping in the wind. The issue is not whether or not the operator of a vessel can remember what to do. It is a question of not doing something important because of a distraction.
